V. NEW COMMITTEE BUSINESS:

a. Town & School District Finance brief.

P. Curro clarified some comments that need to be corrected from the last meeting. P. Curro stated that the Town and School are not SB2 government organizations. We run the SB2 calendar for budget development, but we are not SB2. We are run by municipal and school district charters. P. Curro stated that there is no time limit for open positions. P. Curro stated that the school made a statement a few years ago that they were removing

the IT Director position. P. Curro went over the School District budget. P. Curro presented a PowerPoint. See attached. P. Curro also discussed the agreement with Hooksett.

<u>Christine Perez, 5 Wesley Drive</u>, stated that the Police Department budget is much different than the school budget.

The Londonderry School District has four COVID relief Grants. They have differences in allowable expenditures and periods of eligibility. The total number is \$3,401,427.00. These funds cannot be used to offset the tax rate.

Town Finance Director Justin Campo gave an overview of Town Covid Grants. See attached PowerPoint for a complete list of Grants.

P. Curro went over the line item vs. bottom line budget, the difference between the two and the School and Town budgets. P. Curro also went over the budget for open positions within the School District. See attached PowerPoint. P. Curro stated that since they're close to negotiating a new contract, they will stay with what Hooksett agrees to pay. January is when the contract is brought up. They may up it 250. P. Curro stated that he doesn't see enrollment at the High School spiking.

VI. LIAISON REPORTS:

a. Department of Public Works – Joseph Gagnon

b. Police Department – Steve Breault

S. Breault stated that he spoke with Chief Hart and they can get a surplus of over \$700,000. S. Breault stated that he assumes that factors into what J. Campo was mentioning. J. Campo stated that he likes to go conservative, but that is accurate. S. Breault stated that the body cameras are also still under review.

c. Fire Department – Jonathan Kipp

J. Kipp stated that the Fire Department Operating Budget remains 2% over what it should be in overtime and equipment costs over the pandemic. Vehicle maintenance is also running over but Chief O'Brien is exploring vendors to make sure to get the best deal. Also,
