Oh, the Winter Wonderland...

Snow and snow banks present an extra challenge to residents for trash and recycling collection.

If these containers are in the road they are hampering cleanup efforts. They are a hazard to passing motorists and pedestrians. They may be knocked over spilling their contents, and they may be damaged.



To prevent any of these bad things from happening, residents are reminded to keep all containers out of the road by clearing a place in the snow bank where the containers can be safely placed.

Think of this as the final step in your driveway clearing. A little extra effort will help the trash/recycling collection and snow cleanup efforts run smoothly and help keep everyone safe. And it will be Spring before you know it!

Overflow Trash Bags



Overflow bags can be purchased at the Town Hall Do you occasionally have a situation where you need more room in your trash cart?

Overflow trash bags can be purchased at the Town Clerk's office at Town Hall for \$3 each.

These specially colored and labeled 30-gallon trash bags can be filled with your excess trash and placed on the ground beside your regular trash cart. They will be collected at the same time your trash cart is emptied.

Great for when you have more trash than normal.

Most Common Recycling Contaminants

Keep these common contaminants **OUT** of your recycling



NO Recyclables in Plastic Bags

Empty loose recyclables into your blue recycle barrel, but leave the plastic bag out.



NO Food & Liquids

Compost instead! Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Electronics & Small Appliances

Donate if it's in good condition, or bring items to the Drop Off Center (open seasonally, located at 13 Recovery Way off of West Road).



NO Textiles,

Bedding

Donate these items if they are in good condition otherwise throw in the trash.



NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, Hangers, **Extension Cords**

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



NO Tires, Auto Parts, Scrap Metal

(Not in recycling or trash) Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. For disposal bring to the Drop Off Center (open seasonally, located at 13 Recovery Way, off of West Road).

NO Plastic Bags, Film/Sheeting & Film Packaging

Take plastic bags back to a local grocer to keep bags clean and dry, and prevent them from shutting down recycling facilities.



NO Concrete, Wood **& Construction** Debris

Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. For disposal bring to the Drop Off Center (open seasonally, located at 13 Recovery Way, off of West Road).



Compost if possible, or put in the trash but remember to recycle the cardboard tube.

NO Medical Waste

Store in a rigid plastic con-

tainer (such as a laundry

detergent bottle), tape the

top closed and dispose of

NO Polystyrene Foam

Foam and plastic to-go containers are not recyclable curbside.



NO Non-Recyclable Plastic

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & Beverage bottles, jugs and tubs.



What to Recycle

In July 1, 2016, residents of the Town of Londonderry started bi-weekly single stream recycling in their big blue 96-gallon barrels. ANY recyclable item listed below can be combined in your blue recycling barrel.

Paper:

- Newspapers, Catalogs,
- · Telephone books,
- Junk mail, Cardboard,
- Magazines.
- Milk cartons, Cereal boxes

Corrugated Cardboard:

- Cut down flat,
- slide along inside of cart

Co-Mingled:

- Glass.
- Cans
- Rigid plastic



(Please note all large plastic items such as children's toys, lawn furniture, and containers should be brought to the Londonderry Drop Off Center, at no charge, open seasonally April-November)

Pickups begin at 7:00 AM. The same route is not always taken on your collection day, so please have your materials set out on time!

(i.e.; if your regular pick up day is Monday, your pick up will be delayed until Tuesday, Tuesdays pick up will be on Wednesday etc.)

Do Not bring oil mixed with antifreeze, transmission fluid or any other liquid.

In 2017, volunteers collected 1,521 gallons of waste oil. This oil is used to run the waste oil furnace at the highway *Same day as Hazardous Waste Collection garage.
