Old Business:

• Budget FY24

Erin Matlin shared the Sample Ballot for the election on March 14, 2023. Erin reminded the Board about the poll hours and location.

New Business:

• Relocate Alcove Sprinkler Heads

Erin Matlin shared a quote totaling \$2,600 from Hampshire Fire to move the sprinkler heads in both alcoves closest to the Central Fire Station. The sprinkler heads would be moved to receive the heat from the rest of the building and help prevent future issues with frozen pipes.

The Board would like the work to be completed, but they asked Erin to investigate whether the cost could be covered by the Town.

Juneteenth Holiday

Erin Matlin checked with Town Manager Michael Malaguti to see if the Town would be observing the Juneteenth holiday on Monday, June 19, 2023. The Town will not be closing any of their offices. Erin also shared feedback collected from 67 libraries, which reflected a split decision.

The Board decided that the library should remain open because the Town will also be open. However, the Board would like the library staff to consider offering educational programming specific to the holiday.

Vouchers for Summer Reading

Erin Matlin distributed an example voucher to be used as an Adult Summer Reading Program incentive. The voucher would waive up to \$5.00 in overdue fines and have an expiration date of September 1, 2024. The Board liked the idea of providing the voucher to encourage patrons to sign up for the program.

• Community Survey

Erin Matlin provided all Board members with a draft of the community survey to be distributed in April. A discussion ensued. The Board recommended proceeding with the survey as is.

• Other Business

After serving on the Board of Trustees for over nine years, Cynthia Peterson shared that she is not running for reelection. Erin and the Board thanked her for
