### **Community Survey**

The community survey closed on May 31. 790 people submitted the survey online or on paper. While a full analysis is not available yet, some highlighted results are included below.

- The majority of participants were library cardholders ages 35 and over.
- 94% of respondents were in favor of the library joining GMILCS.
- The top three services that participants are interested in the library adding:
  - 1. Membership in the GMILCS Consortium
  - 2. A library website (separate from LondonderryNH.gov)
  - 3. More adult programs
- The majority of respondents visit the library between once a week and a few times a month.
- The top three days/times when participants are most likely to visit the library:
  - 1. Saturday mornings
  - 2. Thursday evenings
  - 3. Saturday afternoons
- The top three types of additional programs/events participants were interested in:
  - 1. Hands-on crafting/DIY workshops
  - 2. Educational classes or series
  - 3. Author talks
- The top three ways participants learn about library news, programs, and services:
  - 1. Social media/Leach Library Facebook page
  - 2. Leach Library website
  - 3. Local newspapers

## • <u>GMILCS – Membership Inquiry and Presentation</u>

Erin Matlin presented on the Greater Manchester Integrated Library Consortium System (GMILCS) and how the Leach Library's potential membership would benefit the community. Erin reviewed the Consortium's membership requirements and an initial estimate for joining. Donna Plante provided data and feedback related to GMILCS from the community survey. A discussion ensued.

Yvette Couser, President of GMILCS and Director of the Merrimack Public Library, shared her experience and knowledge regarding GMILCS and spoke to the membership benefits. Yvette encouraged questions and concerns from the Board.

Susan Brown, Londonderry resident and Assistant Director of the Derry Public Library, elaborated on Yvette's experience with GMILCS and spoke to the community's expectation of a more advanced automation system.

Londonderry resident Helen Arnold asked about how membership works for academic libraries.

Liz Thomas asked if the Board votes to make a formal inquiry whether it implies any commitment. Yvette confirmed it does not.
